

The objective of this project is to develop digital evaluation tools for Secondary schools to self-evaluate their academic and career guidance program, to develop an academic and career guidance plan and offer an online training module for teachers and guidance practitioners to support teachers as they tackle new challenges and in their role to support and guide students in this unprecedented time.

The TACKLE Checklist is a digital selfevaluation and diagnostic tool for Secondary schools so that as a school they can evaluate the guidance services they provide to their students and how they are supporting them, especially in this very challenging context, often at a distance.

An Action Plan to create a quality School Guidance connecting schools with resources and recommendations. The Guidance Action Plan and Resource is a key support once the Secondary Schools complete the TACKLE Checklist and receive their diagnostic evaluation report – this tool will accompany them as they plan the next steps – in the short, medium and long term.
